Proposed Service

Name of Proposed Service:

Two character name allocation

Technical description of Proposed Service:

\r\nSpecification 5(2) \\'Schedule of Reserved Names\' of the standard Registry Agreement (version of 2nd July 2013) requires that \\'all two-character ASCII labels shall be withheld from registration or allocated to Registry Operator at the second level within the TLD\'.\r\nOn behalf of the following Registry Operators, Famous Four Media is requesting a written waiver from ICANN which would permit the allocation of two-character labels, while still reserving two-letter domains that correspond to the two-letter country code names found on the ISO-3166 alpha-2 list:\r\n\r\nElite Registry Limited (.trade)\r\n\r\nDot Webcam Limited (.webcam)\r\n\r\nDot Bid Limited (.bid)\r\n\r\n(\\'Registry Operators\')\r\n\r\nAs an initial step, we request the release of all two-character ASCII labels in respect of the listed strings or that will be operated by the foregoing Registry Operators, that do not appear on the ISO 3166-1 alpha-2 list and for which there is no corresponding government or country-code operator.

b. Were consultations with gTLD registrars or the registrar constituency appropriate? Which registrars were consulted? What were the nature and content of the consultation?:

\r\nVarious registrars were consulted about their interest in the ASC II strings. There was no formal consultation but the



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informal response was to support the release of those strings. This message is being relayed consistently to other registry operators as well, we understand.

c. Were consultations with other constituency groups appropriate? Which groups were consulted? What were the nature and content of these consultations?:

While Famous Four Media did not take on any direct consultations, we note that: 1) the RSTEP report on GNR's two-character name proposal addresses these issues in a manner which supports the release of two-character names. <https://www.icann.org/en/system/files/files/rstep-gnr-proposal-review-team-report-04dec06-en.pdf> 2) The GNSO Council approved the recommendations sent to the ICANN Board by the Reserved Names Working Group dated 23 May 2007 which recommended that "registries be permitted to release any combination of two letter and/or digit strings provided that measures to avoid confusion with any corresponding country codes are implemented". <http://gns0.icann.org/issues/new-gtlds/final-report-rn-wg-23may07.htm>. 3) Other new gTLD registry operators have recently put in similar requests, which suggests a market trend.

d. Were consultations with end users appropriate? Which groups were consulted? What were the nature and content of these consultations?:

While Famous Four Media Registry Operators did not take on any direct consultations, we have feedback which indicates a high demand from end users to make two-character labels available for registration. We field numerous requests from Registrars requesting the release of these labels for end users.

By the nature of this initial request, there should not be an objection to the release of these two-character labels given that these labels do not appear on the ISO 3166-1 alpha-2 list and therefore do not correspond to a government or country-code operator.

Contractual Provisions

List the relevant contractual provisions impacted by the Proposed Service:

\r\nRegistry Agreement, Specification 5, Section 2:\r\n2. Two-character labels. All two-character ASCII labels shall be withheld from registration or allocated to Registry Operator at the second level within the TLD. Such labels may not be activated in the DNS, and may not be released for registration to any person or entity other than Registry Operator, provided that such two-character label strings may be released to the extent that Registry Operator reaches agreement with the related government and country-code manager of the string as specified in the ISO 3166-1 alpha-2 standard.\r\nThe Registry Operator may also propose the release of these reservations based on its implementation of measures to avoid confusion with the corresponding country codes, subject to approval by ICANN. Upon conclusion of Registry Operator's designation as operator of the registry for the TLD, all such labels that remain withheld from registration or allocated to Registry Operator shall be transferred as specified by ICANN. Registry Operator may self-allocate and renew such names without use of an ICANN accredited registrar, which will not be considered Transactions for purposes of Section 6.1 of the Agreement.

Contract Amendments

\n\nAs permitted under Specification 5, Section 2, Registry Operators may propose the release of the two-character ASCII label reservations where there is the ability to avoid confusion with the corresponding country codes, subject to approval by ICANN.\n\n\nWe are not seeking an amendment to the Registry Agreement, rather we seek approval from ICANN in the form of a written waiver stating that Famous Four Media Registry Operators are permitted to make available for registration those two-character ASCII labels that do not appear on the ISO 3166-1 alpha-2 list and for which there are no corresponding country-code operators.

\n\nThe release of these strings will provide greater consumer choice and competition in the market place and we anticipate that demand for these two-character labels will be high. Two-character strings are highly memorable and accordingly, will benefit both registrants hoping to promote their sites popularity and also end-users. Registrants will clearly benefit from the increased choice.
